With the animated objects selected via the Animation Pane, select '> Start' > 'On Click'.

Preview and Adjust

In the Animation Pane you should see mouse icons besides the selected animations, this shows that the animation will now begin when you click on the presentation screen.

01 Import Object

From the tabs in the ribbon select 'Insert' > 'Pictures'. **Or**, from your computer's File Explorer, simply *select, drag* and *drop* the image directly into the document.

Apply Animation

Select the object you wish to animate and select '*Fly In*' from the animation toolbar at the top. For multiple objects, ensure you group them before selecting the desired animation.

Effects and Timing

From the '*Effects Option*' drop-down list, select the direction you want your object to appear on the screen. Edit the '*Duration*' of this animation

to change how quickly you want your object to appear.

04 Animation Sequence

Right-Click on the group selection from the animation pane and select '*Effect Options*' > '*Bounce*'.



In the Animation Pane, make sure to adjust the timing of the animations and always do a preview of the animation sequence.

Select the object you wish to animate and select '*Fly-In*' from the animation toolbar at the top. For multiple elements, ensure you group them before selecting the desired animation.

Timing and Duration

From the animation toolbar select '*Duration*' to adjust the time it takes for the object to appear.

Do this for each object and select a different length.



To create a bounce effect, *Right Click* on the object or group from the animation pane. Select '*Effect Options'* > '*Bounce*'.

01 Import Object

From the tabs in the ribbon select 'Insert' > 'Pictures'. **Or**, from your computer's File Explorer, simply *select, drag* and *drop* the image directly into the document.

Apply Animation

Select the object you wish to animate and select 'Motion Path' from the animation toolbar at the top. For multiple elements, ensure you group them before selecting the desired animation.

Animation Trigger

From the animation toolbar select 'Effect Options' > 'Adjust Direction' and then select the

direction of travel.

04 Animation Sequence

Drag the red dot on the object to adjust the distance of travel. In the animation pane, *Right Click* and select '*Effect Options'* > '*Auto-Reverse'*. Go to '*Timing'* > 'Until End of Slide'.

PowerPoint: Morph Transitions

2 Duplicate Object

Select the object(s) you wish to animate and duplicate them using *Copy* and *Paste*. Ensure that you have the object(s) on separate slides and positioned where you want them to be.

Animation Sequence pt1

To create a change in the animation sequence you must ensure that there is a difference in

either the position or scale of the objects in question.

Animation Sequence pt2

On the duplicated slide, from the Transition panel select '*Morph*'. The program will create a seamless transition between the identical objects.

05 Preview and Adjust

Make sure to adjust the duration of the transition and always do a preview of the animation sequence.

From the tabs in the ribbon select 'Insert' > 'Pictures'. **Or**, from your computer's File Explorer, simply *select, drag* and *drop* the image directly into the document.

GIF Animation

Rename the object(s) you wish to use as triggers. Apply an animation from the animation toolbar to the selected GIF. In the animation toolbar select '*Trigger'* > 'On Click' > 'Object Name'.

Video Animation pt1

Rename the object(s) you wish to use as triggers. Apply an animation from the animation toolbar to the selected Video. In the animation toolbar select '*Trigger'* > 'On Click' > 'Object Name'.



Select the video and select '*Add Animation'* > '*Play'*, then place the new animation under the correct heading in the animation pane.

PowerPoint: Mask Animations



From the tabs in the ribbon select 'Insert' > 'Pictures'. **Or**, from your computer's File Explorer, simply *select, drag* and *drop* the image directly into the document.

02 Object Creation

Select the **object1** you wish to act as a *mask* and duplicate them using *Copy* and *Paste*. *Select* '*Insert*' > '*Shape*'. In the Shape Format toolbar, ensure the <u>shape</u> has no outlines, covers the *masking* **object1**, and has a *Shape Fill*.



With the <u>shape</u> behind the **object1**, select both and choose '*Merge Shapes*' > '*Subtract*' to create a

mask. Place object2 over the new subtraction.

Animation Sequence

Insert a <u>shape</u> behind the mask. In the selection pane, select **mask** > '*Format Shape'* > '*Slide Background Fill'*. Now you can add an animation effect to **object2**.

Preview and Adjust

Make sure to adjust the duration of the animation and always do a preview of the animation sequence.

- Filmbox Format .fbx files
- Object Format *.obj files
- 3D Manufacturing Format *.3mf files
- Polygon Format *.ply files
- StereoLithography Format *.stl files
- Binary GL Transmission Format *.glb files
